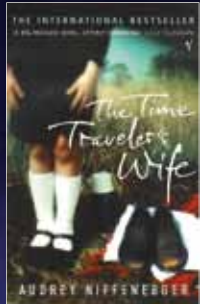
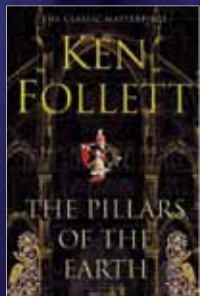


**No 4** 'Shoot all the Bluejays you want, if you can hit 'em, but remember it's a sin to kill a Mockingbird.'

A lawyer's advice to his children as he defends the real mockingbird of this classic novel - a black man charged with attacking a white girl, in the Deep South of the 1930s.



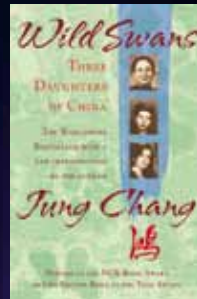

**No 8** *The Pillars of the Earth* tells the story of Philip, a devout and resourceful monk driven to build the greatest Gothic cathedral the world has known; of Tom, the mason who becomes his architect - a man divided in his soul; of the beautiful, elusive Lady Aliena, haunted by a secret shame; and of a struggle between good and evil that will turn church against state, and brother against brother.



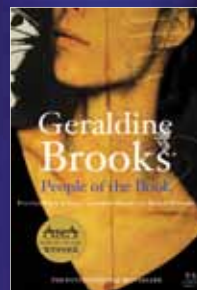
**No 10** Nazi Germany 1939. By her brother's graveyard, the young Liesel Meminger finds a book: *The Gravedigger's Handbook*. This book ignites Liesel's love affair with reading and soon she is stealing books from Nazi book-burnings. Superbly written, *The Book Thief* is an enduring and unforgettable tale.



**No 34** Through the true story of three generations of women, *Wild Swans* tells nothing less than the whole tumultuous history of China's tragic twentieth century, from sword-bearing warlords to Chairman Mao, from the Manchu Empire to the Cultural Revolution. At times terrifying, but also astonishing.



**No 43** Set in Leningrad in 1941 against Hitler's invasion of Russia, this story tells of the impossible love between a Russian girl, Tatiana, and a young officer named Alexander. It is a love that could tear Tatiana's family apart and it carries a secret that could mean death for anyone who hears it.



**No 88** *People of the Book* crosses continents and centuries to bring stories of hope amidst darkness, compassion amidst cruelty, all bound together by the discoveries made by Hannah Heath, a young Australian woman restoring an ancient Hebrew book amidst the ruins of war-torn Sarajevo, and her encounter with Ozren Karamen, the young librarian who risked his life to save the book.
